Topic Focus: Geography

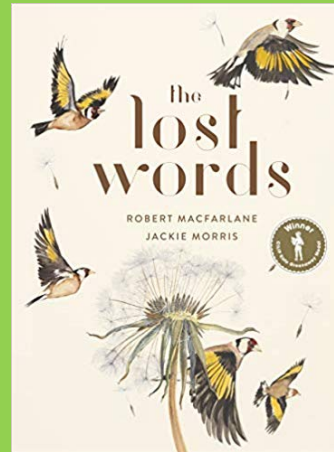
In our Topic lessons, we will be carrying out fieldwork within our local area. This will include: becoming familiar with the eight points on a compass, using a map and digital technology to sketch a map and to recognise human and physical features within the village of Chesterton.

In Science, we will be learning about what plants and trees need to survive, how plants and trees germinate and effective methods of seed dispersal.

English:

Our English units this term will be related to 'The Lost Words' by Robert Macfarlane and Jackie Morris. We will be writing our own stories, descriptions and poetry alongside having the opportunity to develop our performing and speaking and listening skills. Following on from this, we will be using 'The Tin Forest' by Helen Ward in contrast to 'The Lost Words', where we will be developing our persuasive writing and debating skills.

Mathematics:

The children will start the term by learning about number and place value. They will then apply this understanding to addition and subtraction learning formal and informal methods. We will also be placing a strong emphasis on recall and fluency with times tables.
