English:

This term we will be recapping our sentence writing skills. We will be ensuring all sentences have: capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. Then, we will gradually begin to use a wider range of punctuation marks throughout our sentences such as commas, inverted commas, exclamation and question marks.

There will also be a big focus on developing our handwriting skills, using the correct letter formation and consistently using cursive script.

Our English units this term will be related to our topic of 'Heroes'. We will be exploring traditional tales, including the heroic story of Beauty and The Beast.

We will also develop our non-fiction writing, through writing our own well-structured explanation texts.

Creative Curriculum:

History

This term, we will be looking at significant individuals. In particular, we will be focusing on Mary Seacole. We will be considering what made Seacole so significant and any heroic qualities that she displayed.

Art
