English Activities:

Write a 'Top 10 Facts' page all about you or something that you are interested in.

Think of as many adjectives as you can to describe this dragon:



Write a recount of a day in the life of a king or queen. What would they eat for breakfast? What places might they visit? What else might they get up to in the day?

Write a letter to Father Christmas. What questions would you like to ask him about his job?

Maths Activities:

Find a fun way to represent the numbers 11 – 20. You could take a photo of objects or draw pictures.

What Maths can you do with these jellybeans? Can you count them? Sort them? Group them in twos?



Can you recall all of the number bonds that add up to make 10?

Use the symbols < / > / = to compare some numbers between 1 – 20.







Topic Activities:

Choose a king or queen from British history and draw or paint a portrait of them.



Make some number cards to hide in your garden and write some clues of where to find them. Once you have set them up, see if a family member can follow your clues to find all the numbers! They could then set up a treasure hunt for you!

Have a look at the different types of technology you have at home. Make a list of them and think about why they are useful.

Find out how Christmas is celebrated around the world. Are there any traditions that you would like to try?
