

Each week need to choose one of these activities to complete and hand in on Wednesday in your homework book. Make sure you choose a range of activities (some from each box) during the term.

Maths Activities:

- **Measuring:** Practise measuring capacity and weight when baking, or measure the length of a piece of furniture using a tape measure. Compare a number of objects and put them in order from longest to shortest, heaviest to lightest or largest to smallest capacity.
- **Money:** Practice finding change using the following game online:

- Roll a dice to get two numbers, instead of adding try multiplying (x) them instead. Can you draw a picture to help you work it out?
- Can you think of a fun and unique way to teach other children the 3, 4 and 8 times tables? You could create a poster, make a video or even create a rap.

English Activities:

- Have a go at writing the Christmas story from a different perspective. Think about how the donkey may have felt, or the inn keeper. Read Jesus' Christmas party by Nicholas Allan for some ideas.
- Read or listen to a story. Try to write down what you enjoyed most about the story and why. It could be the descriptions of the characters, the setting or what happened to make you laugh.
- Create your own Christmas decoration, then write the instructions so that they can be followed by someone else. Remember to include imperative verbs, adverbs, pictures or diagrams and a list of what you need.
- Is there something that you want for Christmas or somewhere you want to go? Have a go at writing a persuasive letter or note. Can you persuade your Mum or Dad just by using your words?

Topic Activities:

- Have a go at making your very own artefact that would have been around in the Tudors. It may be a toy, such as a cup and ball, or you could do some sewing by making a baby. It maybe that you want to make some pottery. Don't forget most cups had 2 handles! Remember to carry out research and explain how you made your model. Can you share this information with others in an interesting way?
- Choose your favourite animal and have a go at making a model of its habitat. Use different materials to make it as realistic as possible.
- Think about the Christmas traditions in your house. How are they different to the traditions from Christmas in the times of the Tudors?
- Create a map of the area that you live. Pay attention to local landmarks and try to include them where you can. Don't forget to label your map to make it clear.
