Physical Education and Sport at Chesterton (Sports Premium Report)

Sport plays a key role in school life at Chesterton. Children throughout the school are coached by professional coaches and experienced teachers both within curriculum time and during our after school clubs. All pupils take part in two timetabled PE

lessons per week. Our PE curriculum covers all areas of the curriculum including swimming, gymnastics, dance, athletics and team games. Our focus is on skills and older pupils use these in specific games and have opportunities to compete against other local schools. Sports Day is a popular event in our school calendar, where all children have the opportunity to compete at their level.

At Chesterton, we are very lucky to be a part of a Sports Partnership which was established with the aim of improving the quality and quantity of school sport and physical education within the local network of schools.

As well as improving PE and school sport for all its pupils, the partnership plays a major role in developing sporting opportunities within the local community. Chesterton School is an integral part of the School Sport Partnership programme. The Partnership Activities Co-ordinator is Rory Mown. He is based at Bicester Community College and co-ordinates the organisation of competitions and tournaments, involving all school in the Partnership, at intra-, inter- and county level. The Partnership is based around Bicester's secondary schools and we are part of the Bicester Community College 'family'

Apart from entering tournaments and activities arranged through the partnership, we also enjoy friendly village competitions in football and cricket with Bruern Abbey School and provide a range of sports clubs for our children after school.

In 2014-2015 our Sports Premium will be £8,535.

We have allocated £4,267 to finance continued membership of NOSSP, which will provide/support:

- Sports Coach mentoring
- · Audit of staff competencies and training needs
- Work towards Bronze Kite mark

Remaining funding will go towards £5320 to provide enriched sports provision (Club Energy). Which will provide/support:

- Quality after school sports participation
