

Our topic this term is 'Once Upon a Time...'

Literacy Activities:

1. Read, listen to or watch the story of Cinderella. Using the 'Cinderella Descriptions' resource sheet, match up the describing words with the correct characters from the story. If you are not able to print all of the words cards, you (or your adult) can write the words next to each character.
2. Read, listen to or watch the story of Little Red Riding Hood. Using the 'Little Red Riding Hood Descriptions' resource sheet, match up the words with the correct characters from the story.
3. Choose one of the fairy tale characters from the resources page and write three clues to describe them. For example, you could write the following clues for the Big Bad Wolf... 'He has sharp teeth. He has a long nose. He has pointy ears'. Don't tell anyone else which character you have chosen! You can share the clues that you have written during our small group Zoom call on Thursday, and see if the rest of the children can guess which character you have described!
4. Choose one of the fairy tale story maps on the resources page. Cut and stick the pictures in the correct order to tell the main events of the story. If you would like to draw your own map instead, that is fine. You only need to do one story map, but if you would like to do more, that's okay too!

Maths Activities:

1. Watch this Oak Academy lesson on counting and ordering numbers up to 20. If you would like an extra challenge, try ordering numbers to 30.

2. Watch this Oak Academy lesson. It's about developing a sense of 10, and understanding that the teen numbers represent 10 + another number. For example $13 = 10 + 3$.

3. This Oak Academy lesson builds on yesterday's learning. You will learn to represent teen numbers on a tens frame. I have put a tens frame resource on the Home Learning area of the website for you to use (Or you can draw them in your book). Use the blank one today – the coloured in ones are for tomorrow's session!

4. Use the colourful tens frames on the Home Learning page of the website. Ask your grown up to hide them around the room. You need to find the frames and write down the teen number that they are showing. Remember, a full frame = 10. So count on from 10 with the spots on other frame to get the answer!

Topic Activities:

Circle Time/ PSED – Feelings. Continue watching 'The Big Book of Feelings' by Mary Hoffman

Recap the feeling of 'happy' that was focused on last week, and refer back to the poster you made. You can continue to watch the video, and learn about some of the other feelings – sad, excited, bored, angry etc.

P.E. – Work on your rolling skills this week. Use chalk on the ground outdoors to draw some different sized circles. If you are indoors, you can lay different sized circles of paper on the floor. Now, you have to try and roll a ball carefully, so that it land inside the circles! Big circles = 1 point, medium circles = 2 points, and small circles = 3 points! Is it easier to score when you are close to the circles or far away? When is it best to roll the ball hard? When is it best to roll the ball gently?

Topic – Learning about materials and words to describe them. Use the 'Materials Information', 'Different Materials' and 'Materials – Describing Words' resource sheets on the Home Learning page.

Topic – Think back to your work from last week on floating and sinking! Follow this Oak Academy lesson to create a boat that floats!
