

Each week, you need to choose one of these activities to complete and hand in on Wednesday in your homework book. Make sure you choose a range of activities (some from each box) during the term.




English Activities:

- Research some real life heroes, for example; a nurse, a soldier, a police officer, and write a description of this hero. What makes them so heroic?
- Create your own acrostic poem. Can you base it on one of your heroes? Remember, you can include rhyme and alliteration!
- Have a go at making a poster to tell people how to write a good sentence, reminding them about capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. How can you make a sentence ever better? Think about expanded noun phrases and adjectives!
- Write a recount of something that you enjoyed doing in the summer holidays. Remember to write in the past tense and include lots of adjectives to describe.
- Write a letter to a real life hero to say thank you for their service.

Maths Activities:

- Have a go at working out some addition and subtraction number sentences. Can you remember which sign to use for which? Have a go at using different methods and explore what helps you.
- Can you think of a way to remind others about odd and even numbers? Is there a rule that people should know? It may be a poster, a rhyme or even a number line.
- Choose a number. Can you work out 10 more and 10 less as well as 100 more and 100 less?
- Don't forget to log onto Mathletics to try the Maths games!



Topic Activities:

- Go on a material hunt around your house and garden. Can you describe some of the materials you find? Which are soft, hard, stretchy, and solid?
- Can you create a poster to explain why we celebrate Harvest Festival?
- Research a famous person who you think has helped other people, for example; Nelson Mandela or Mary Seacole. Can you create a fact file on this person?
- Take a look at how the outside is changing as we go into autumn. Create a poster to describe the season of autumn. What is changing with the trees and weather?
