


2020 Autumn Term 2 Year 3 Enriching Learning

Each week, you need to choose one of these activities to complete and hand in on Wednesday in your homework book. Make sure that you choose a range of activities (some from each box) during the term.


English Activities:



- Can you make a list of the all the words that require an apostrophe for contraction? For example: Cannot- Can't, I have- I've.
 Remember to put the apostrophe in the correct place.
- Read some poems and then have a go at writing your own! It could include rhyme, alliteration or it could be an acrostic poem! You could be inspired by something that you have learnt about in our topic work or maybe Christmas!
- Choose your favourite book. Can you write a brief description so that someone could guess what it is about?
- Think of some adjectives and noun phrases to describe fireworks. You could draw a picture to go with your words.
- Write a letter to Father Christmas on behalf
 of somebody else. Is there something your
 Mum or Dad would love to get? Or even a
 friend? Write to Father Christmas telling him
 the reasons that they deserve it.

Maths Activities:

- Write the multiplication and division fact families for one of the following times tables: 3, 4, 8 or 10.
- Keep adding and subtracting multiples of ten from 3-digit numbers: e.g. 346+50= 692-60=
- Can you spot and identify the names of 3D objects around your house?
 Challenge: Can you spot any right angles, acute or obtuse angles?
- Keep a time diary for a week. Try your best to tell the time yourself. What time do you wake up? What time do you have your breakfast? What time do you go to school? And lots more!
- Don't forget to log onto Mathletics to try the Maths games!



Topic Activities:

- Research some facts about South Africa. Can you describe some of the similarities and differences between South Africa and the UK?
- If you could have a superpower what would it be? Draw a picture or write a story about the adventures you went on.
- Draw a portrait of Mary Seacole.
- As we approach Remembrance Day, can you think of any heroic qualities people of war and conflict have shown?
- Research different Superheroes.
 Pick your favourite one and write a fact file on them. What makes them so special?
