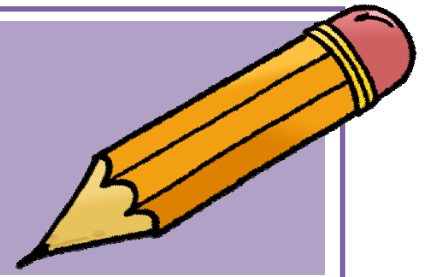

Each week, you need to choose one of these activities to complete and hand in on Wednesday in your homework book. Make sure that you choose a range of activities (some from each box) during the term.

English Activities:

- Write a recount of one of your days from the Easter holiday. Remember to write in chronological order.



- Practise writing using inverted commas. You could think of a conversation between you and a friend.
- Imagine you are going on a Jungle Safari! Can you write a postcard home to describe to your family what you can see?
- Retell the story of The Jungle Book in your own words.
- Create a wordsearch for your weekly spellings. Can a friend or family member complete it?
- Chose an animal from a different place in the world. Research some interesting facts about this animal. Can you write a report to tell me all about the facts you have found?

Maths Activities:

- Have a go at an addition, subtraction, multiplication and division question. With each one you do, can you use two or more different methods to work it out?
- Create a tally chart of your family's favourite minibeast or animal. Create a bar graph, pie graph pictogram or any other kind of graph to share your information. Have a go at asking and answering questions about your data. What is the most popular animal? What is the least popular animal?
- Have a go at making your own word problems for addition and subtraction. For example, Miss Claridge has 14 sweets, Mrs Cresswell has 12. How many do they have altogether?
- Can you recognise o'clock, half past, quarter to and quarter past on a clock? Challenge: can you tell the time to the nearest 5 minutes?

- Have your own May Day celebrations with your family. Perhaps you have a picnic or decorate a tree in your back garden with ribbons and flowers.
- Draw your favourite Jungle book character.
- Photography challenge... can you take a picture of an animal in its own natural habitat?
- Research the continents of the world. If you had the choice, which one would you like to live on and why?
- From the 28th May - 13th June it is the Great British Spring Clean. Feel free to carry out your own litter pick in your local area. Remember, you must be supervised by an adult and wear gloves!
