<u>Curriculum</u>

We are looking forward to diving into our new topic of 'Britain Begins'. This will focus on the pre-history of Britain from Stone Age to Iron Age. We also have many other exciting lessons planned, including learning how to sew and exploring how to introduce ourselves using the French language. <u>Homework</u>

The 'Enriching Learning' homework sheet will be posted on the school website with the expectation that one piece is to be returned to school, completed, every **Thursday**. Books will be returned to children on Friday. Alternatively, the children can complete the Mathletics task, which will be set and checked every **Thursday**.

Please look out for the weekly spelling/phonics pattern sheets, which will be provided by your child's spelling/phonics teacher every **Thursday**. Your child will be tested on words connected to this rule or pattern on the following **Thursday**.

Reading records will be checked every **Friday**. Please try to encourage your child to read regularly throughout the week. 5-10 minutes of extra reading daily, with an adult or independently, will really support the work that we do within school. Please make sure that each entry includes the title, page numbers and a comment.

<u>P.E.</u>

This term, the children will have P.E. lessons on Mondays and Tuesdays. P.E. kits should remain in school at all times, apart from when needing to be taken home to be washed. All children should have indoor and outdoor kit, including a house t-shirt, shorts, tracksuit bottoms, a warm long-sleeved top and trainers. **Please make sure that your child's P.E. kit and school uniform is clearly named.**

Contact with the Class Teacher

If you wish to make contact with me, there are a number of ways that you can do this.

- You could send a message (written or verbal) with your child.
- You are able to phone the School Office, who will be able to help you or pass on a message.

- Alternatively, I will usually be available at the end of the school day once all of the children have been collected and this would be a good time to have a quick conversation. A longer meeting can then be arranged at a mutually convenient time if required.

Reminders

- **Break-time snacks** When children reach Year 3, they are no longer eligible for the free fruit snack scheme at break. Please send a healthy snack in for your children. This should fruit or vegetables. Cereal bars or fruit-based sweets are not suitable for break-time snacks.
- Water Bottles Please make sure children have a clear, named water bottle with them every day (separate from any drink in their lunchbox) as this allows access to water as and when they require it. Please note, there should only be water in these bottles (not squash, juice, flavoured or fizzy water).
- **Outdoor Footwear –** All children should be prepared for outdoor play by keeping wellies and a warm waterproof coat in school.
